General Description: Certain animals suffer from anxiety and fear which can lead to undesirable behaviors such as nervousness, hyperactivity, excess barking, destructiveness and inappropriate elimination. Often there are environmental stressors that can contribute to these episodes including car travel, changes in environment, fireworks, thunderstorms, plus kennel and grooming visits. Calming Supplements may assist in alleviating stress and anxiety in your pet. These products are given by mouth and are available in many oral formulations.

What is this product? Calming Supplements may contain any of the following ingredients which work towards supporting calm and balanced behavior:

L-Tryptophan

L-Theanine

Milk proteins

Vitamins such as thiamine (Vitamin B1)

Herbs such as hops, passion flower, ginger, catnip, valerian root, chamomile, St. John's wort

Some Calming Supplements utilize a homeopathic approach and may contain, but are not limited, to any of the following ingredients:

Meadow saffron

Passion flower

Valerian root

Silver nitrate

Reasons for using this product:

To help alleviate stress related behavior problems

A calm pet can better respond to appropriate training and behavior modification

Animal Precautions:

Jimson Weed

This supplement is labeled for use in cats and dogs and should be administered only when and as prescribed by a licensed veterinarian

Certain herbs and homeopathic solutions may interfere with blood clotting and should not be used prior surgery

Certain products can not be used in young kittens or puppies

Safety has not been established in breeding or pregnant animals

Animals with a known hypersensitivity or allergy to this or related products should not be given this medication

Directions: Calming Supplements should be given according to your veterinarian's instructions. Read and follow the product label carefully. The dosing schedule may vary for acute or chronic issues and the dose may be adjustable during times of anticipated stress.

This supplement can take several days to have full effects within the body, but side effects can occur immediately. Visible improvements are not always evident with supplements.

Many products are intended for intermittent use. It is recommended that this supplement be given for only as long as your veterinarian directs.

Supplements are not regulated by the FDA. As such, they have not been required to go through the same rigorous testing for efficacy that drugs undergo and many products are not created equally. Many products on the market are high quality and are made by reputable companies. Consult with your veterinarian to choose the right product for your pet.

What if a dose is missed?

If a dose is missed, give it as soon as you can. If it is time already for the next dose, skip the missed dose and go back to the normal schedule. Do not give two doses at the same time.

What to tell/ask your veterinarian before giving this product?

Talk to your veterinarian about:

How to recognize fear or anxious behaviors in your pet

What may be the primary cause of anxiety in your pet

How to utilize behavior modification to manage symptoms of anxiety or fear in your pet

What tests may need to be performed prior to and during treatment with this supplement

When your pet may need to be re-examined

What are the risks and benefits of using this supplement

Tell your veterinarian about:

If your pet has experienced side effects on other drugs/products

If your pet has experienced any other medical problems or allergies

If your pet has experienced digestive upset now or ever

All medicines and supplements that you are giving your pet or plan to give your pet, including those you can get without a prescription. Your veterinarian may want to check that all of your pet's medications can be given together.

If your pet is pregnant, nursing or if you plan to breed your pet in the near future

Storage and Warnings:

Calming Supplements should be stored in a childproof container in a cool, dry place at room temperature away from heat and direct sunlight.

Keep this and all medication out of reach of children and pets.

Call your physician immediately if you accidentally take this product.

Potential side effects:

This product is usually well tolerated and adverse reactions are uncommon at recommended doses

There can be a concern with overdosing and toxicities when giving multiple supplements. Talk to your veterinarian about all of the supplements your are currently giving your pet.

Notify your veterinarian immediately if your pet experiences any adverse reactions to this product

This supplement should stop working within 24 hours, although effects may last longer in pets with liver or kidney disease

Can this drug be given with other medications?

It may not be recommended to use this supplement in conjunction with other behavior modification drugs or central nervous system medication

Do not give new food, supplements, or medications without first talking to your veterinarian

If your pet experiences any unusual reactions when taking multiple medications, contact your veterinarian

What should I do if I know of or suspect there has been an overdose?

Contact your veterinarian immediately if your pet receives more than the recommended amount.

What else should I know? Notify your veterinarian if your pet's condition does not improve or worsens despite this treatment. As with all supplements, it should only be given to the pet for which it was recommended, at the prescribed amount, as directed by your veterinarian.
